Council Chair Report

For May 27, 2025

The following are the actions taken since the last Council meeting:

Fire Alert – received a call from our alarm company for a fire alert, proceeded to the church, discovered a panel issue had occurred when batteries where being switched out. The issue was resolved a few days later. I asked that my cell be used for such calls rather than my landline.

Grass cutting – discussed with Sarah H. who offered to create a schedule. The schedule is in circulation. As Sarah no longer will be leading this initiative the Property Committee was informed.

Met with Finance chair in person and by phone to discuss various matters. Most of these matters are referred to in the Finance report.

Pastor's Request – Called for an email discussion and vote regarding Pastor Zsofi's attendance at the Pride event June 1 as representative of St. Mark's and part of the MNO delegation.

Church Yard Clean-up – discussed this initiative with Mary who volunteered to take leadership and coordinated discussion with Rhonda regarding the 'Rainbow Gardeners" which will once again be planted out by Raymond and his group.

Meeting with Pastor Zsofi – met with Pastor Zsofi by phone to discuss various arrangements for the upcoming weeks much of which will be reflected in the Council meeting.

Membership Review – the CCCO committee Chair, Signe, has initiated a meeting for May 30 to discuss the process for a membership review to update and accurately reflect our current status.

Finance Update - May 22, 2024

1. Retroactive Pension Contributions for Office Administrator

- Our offer of a lump sum payment to the Office Administrator in lieu of missed 2024 contributions to the ELCIC pension plan was turned down
- Subsequent email exchanges with GSI confirm the following:
 - Total remuneration in 2024: \$7.961.94
 - Employer Contribution @ 8%: \$636.99
 - o Employee Contribution @7%: \$557.34
- St. Mark's must remit both employee and employer contributions to GSI and then recover the employee contribution through payroll deductions.
- Since we no loner pay this staff person directly, we are working with Messiah Lutheran to resolve how the funds will be recovered. Noted that the T4 issued to the office administrator from St. Mark's in 2024 must be updated to reflect the employee contribution to the pension plan.

Question: Does council wish to recover the employee's contribution over one pay period or have the recovery spread over more than one period?

2. Allocation of the balance of the Leisle bequest

- The total value of the bequest was \$18,344,15
- To date, the following allocations have been approved:
 - Memorial Fund: \$5,000
 - Refugee Sponsorship Fund: \$5,000
- Suggested options for allocating the balance of the funds:
 - Capital Works Fund to serve as seed money for a future capital project such as replacement of sanctuary carpeting
 - Augment the Social Ministry Trust Fund. Based on a recommendation from the Social Ministry Committee, income earned by the fund is disbursed each year to a charitable cause.
 - o Refurbishment of the community garden

3. Other Business

- We have identified two possible replacements for L. Joyal on the Finance Committee. BL to approach each in turn to ascertain their interest.
- Investigating a downgrade to our QuickBooks account. Would be a savings of \$30 per month but would mean scaling back the number of persons who can access the software from five to three.
- CRA Charity Return for 2024 was filed May 22.

CLAY Fundraising

Here is a summary of the Youth events / fundraisers

CLAY: Saskatoon August 21 - 24

There will be 8 youth and 2 Youth leaders from St. Mark's attending the Saskatoon Clay event this year. The bus will leave from Winnipeg on Monday, August 18th and return on Monday, August 25th afternoon. The bus trip portion will include driving to Riding Mountain National Park and spending 4 days there of recreation and learning/service activities. CLAY will be held in downtown Saskatoon, starting on Thursday August 21 to Sunday August 24. Our committee will soon be reviewing the CLAY finances and will be meeting to determine costs and subsidy for the participants. As an aside, Cyan Gargol will be attending the CLAY event as part of the CLAY technical team. Their costs will be covered at the Synod level.

Quiz Night / Gift basket raffles:

Quiz night was held on May 3rd at St. Mark's church. There were approximately 50 people in attendance. The night was fun and competitive for all the participants, with the winning table only winning by a few points. Along with Quiz night the Gift basket raffle was held that night. Both events were successful fundraisers for the youth raising around \$1,200.

Glenlea Plant Sale:

There were 23 people that ordered plants as part of the Youth plant sale. The orders were picked up on Saturday May 10th. The event raised over \$500 for the Youth.

Easter Breakfast

On Easter Sunday the youth hosted the annual Easter pancake breakfast. The church hall was packed full of people, enjoying fellowship and coffee with their pancake breakfast. The event raised close to \$400 for the Youth.

Our committee appreciates the council's commitment to the Youth with the \$5,000 set aside in the budget to offset CLAY costs. Once our committee has met to discuss the current Youth funds and the CLAY costs we can provide a financial update if required to the council finance member, council chair or the council, please let me know

Social Ministry Committee Report

MAY 2025

1. Community Gardens

Raymond Ngarboui of Rainbow Community Gardens¹ has confirmed that his group will plant St. Mark's community gardens again this year. Their one concern was that after many years of planting, the soil could definitely use some amendment. The Community Garden budget has sufficient funds in it to order fresh soil and manure. We are waiting for Robert to confirm a date when the group will be available to move the new soil into the gardens and then we will place an order for delivery. That will hopefully happen early in June.

The Rainbow Community Garden project is an initiative of Knox United Church which partners with other organizations to provide gardening opportunities to immigrant families. St. Mark's has partnered with Rainbow Community Gardens for many years. These gardens feature unique home-country vegetables.

2. Refugee Sponsorship

Fundraising for the sponsorship fund is moving forward very well. With the pledges in hand (from Gimli and 2 individuals) and the \$9,295.00 raised at the Epiphany Taste of Syria dinner, this brings us to \$22,590 plus \$6000 in pledges yet to be paid. It will be comforting if the fund ends up having a little more than \$30K available, as the costs of rent and groceries continue to rise.

In terms of date of arrival, there is still no indication when the Magribi family will receive approval to travel. Rhonda is in regular contact with them and they have asked that their sincere thanks be shared with St Mark's.

Related to the sponsorship initiative, a number of our former refugee friends have been invited to attend St Mark's June 22 'World Refugee Day' celebration. In addition to the Alkhatabs and Mohgrabi/Magribi families, Hanaa and Hammoud Jumaa and family (sponsored by St Mark's and Bethel Mennonite in 2016) have been invited and a number of the community gardeners, including Raymond Ngarboui will attend.

3. Committee Membership, Roles

In April Stephen Sauer resigned from Social Ministry Committee after several years of contributing to our initiatives. This month the remaining committee members (Rhonda Lorch, Sila Kisoso and Jennifer Moroz) elected Jennifer Moroz as chairperson and secretary for this term. Most business is transacted through email so the dual role should not be onerous. Jennifer has canvassed a few parishioners about joining the committee and is hopeful for a positive response from one or two people.

4. Annual Plan

The Committee will be meeting in the fall to determine an annual plan of activities.

What was the most spiritually enriching this past month and why?

I would say that I am most thankful for the readings and my executive leadership certificate cohort members. Our learnings and our gatherings have been SO meaningful, affirming, and exactly what I have needed to better understand my leadership style and practice. I continue to look forward as they journey with me and I with them. God has put me amongst some incredible women with incredible wisdom, and I am becoming more confident in who I am and what I want to be as a disciple of Christ and as a leader.

What was most difficult this month that needs prayer and Council's input?

I think the most difficult thing this month has been balancing a personal medical issue with some my work demands and social needs. I am feeling a bit stretched thin, but I am not feeling at all negative about it. I'm also not feeling overly positive about the things in my life right now. I just am. And I truly am okay with that feeling – but I would appreciate prayer to find some balance as we sort out the root cause of what's troubling my body.

I attended Rev. Leslie's funeral on the 16th with many other colleagues, and while it was a beautiful and loving time, it also became a reminder, as we spoke with each other afterwards, of how many of us carry a physical toll of ministry in our bodies, sometimes unconsciously.

How is my spiritual relationship, my relationship with the congregation, & my relationship with my family?

God and I are good. Could be better, could be worse. I thank God for holding the good and the bad for me. I ask God to be patient with me and to teach me to listen to God more than I do.

I have been having some very good connections with members during coffeetime lately. Some deeply pastoral conversations that are openings for further conversations at another time. I am grateful that people feel I am approachable and a safe place for their questions and vulnerabilities. I am beyond blessed to create space for people to share what is on their soul, heart, and mind and for me to carry them in prayer in the days and weeks ahead.

Things at home are well enough. Paul's work demands are going to escalate significantly over the next 5 weeks, and I hope that as this phase of the project comes to an end, we will both have some rest from what has been a particularly stressful season, but especially that he will move on to something more enriching and fulfilling.

We've Been, We Are, and We're Going On

Generosity - "We value the abundant sharing of our love, time and talents."

- I continue to consider how best to bring adaptive changes to the current model of committees and chairpersons.

Inclusiveness - "We believe that differences enrich our community and our common ground is our loving Creator. We are called to love and support each other following Christ's example. All people, including people of all sexual orientation, gender identities, race, beliefs, faiths and abilities are welcome to be who they are in this community."

- I have been assisting the Synod with the Pride Parade planning for our representation. Thank you to Council for your approval for my presence at the parade in representing St Marks and the Synod.
- I have had a number of conversations with members of the congregation recently that have begun from questions of inclusivity and have become deeply personal and pastoral interactions. I am grateful that members feel that they can be so vulnerable with me in asking these questions and sharing what they would like to work through.

Nurturing - "We value the relationships we have in our community by nurturing and supporting each other in times of struggle, respecting differences of opinion, and dealing with conflicts in an open manner."

- As we move to summer, I am hoping to once again begin making a weekly commitment to multiple visits with members. I enjoy this time, and I am hopeful that it will expand beyond the place-bound and our most elderly members.
- I will be looking to meet with Wei-An to discuss her departure from us as the Senior Youth Leader and transitions. She has already made a recommendation regarding a replacement, and I have shared that recommendation with Marijus. I have spoke with that person and asked them to take some time to pray and discern if this is something that they are interested in, or if they would like to serve in a different way.

Justice - "We value working towards peace and justice in the world around us through collaboration with other organizations and faith groups."

- This past month has not seen much in the way of collaboration with other organizations or faith groups, as I believe many are in preparation mode. Our Anglican siblings are preparing for their General Synod, as we are preparing for National Convention. I expect to be invited to the next quarterly River Heights MultiFaith Forum soon.
